1 MTM Black Predator II \$895 This military-grade watch will appeal to the stealthiest among us. The hour indicators are simple cutouts in the let black face. and the subdials have a multilavered. pinball-machine quality, which makes the orange stopwatch hands and tritium-tube hour and minute hands jump off the face. Bonus: you can adjust the steel band

by a 64-ton tank. If you're in the market for tech features. look elsewhere; this piece is all about timeless and tough. swissarmy.com

3. Casio G-Shock **Gulfmaster GWN-**1000 \$500 What does this du-

rable, solar-powered G-Shock offer? Altimeter, compass, thermometer, tide graph, 29-city world time, and (the new thing) a barometricpressure sensor and he'd sport this deepocean-style piece. It's waterproof to 200 meters and the Super-Luminova dial bursts in glowing green when the lights go out. It also transitions effortlessly to land missions, thanks to the antiglare face, momentum watch.com

5. Tsovet JPT-PW36 \$225 Six-year-old Tsovet is known for oversize dials and bold displays. Here it takes a big step toward the classic and understated with a throwback designin copper (pictured), champagne, and black-on a modest, one-inch dial. The JPT-PW36 has a hand-stitched leather band and domed crystal, but it's just as tough and water-resistant as Tsovet's other models. tsovet.com

6. Szanto 1201 \$325 Szanto, a new spinoff from a founder of Luminox, aims to revive a more gentlemanly era of adventure, with the bigger case size and quartz movement that modern fellas like. The thin yet solidly built 1201 works as a stopwatch and enhances the antiquev feel with a homespun canvas band. szanto time.com
